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The SRI VENKATESWARA ANADHA SEVA SADAN (SVASS) NGO has formed during 1995, which is a registered No. **57/95** on under society's registration Act. The area of operation of this institution is confined to the entire state of Andhra Pradesh. The main objects of this society is to work for the up-lift of down trodden rural stake holders by taking up the appropriate suitable activities such as Socio-Economic, Self Employment/Vocational Trainings, Environment, Educational, Disabled Welfare, HIV/AIDS and General Medical and health Programmes. This organization is rendering services to the rural population by giving counseling; Orientation; creating awareness; conducting mobile medical camps cultural activities, Handicrafts, Jute, women and child development Programmes. More further we have participated in Rural Development Programmes extending our voluntary service towards formation of roads; Deepening and sitting of irrigation tanks, helping the Poorest of the poor in the construction of dwelling houses, family planning; pulse polio Programmes and so on.

### **International Day of Yoga Celebration**

Sri Venkateswara Anadha Seva Sadan (SVASS) , Free Yoga camps and celebrated International Day of Yoga in public ground Anantapur district, Andhra Pradesh, India. on 21<sup>st</sup> June. The institute organized a high reaching Yoga demonstration programme for the general public, officials , students and residential members of Chittoor district, Prior to International Day of Yoga, Yoga classes were conducted.

### **Integrated National Diabetes Prevention Control Protection Program (INDPCP)**

#### **DIABETES PRIORITIES**

SVASS WITH NIETs advocacy is driven by the ambition to improve the lives of people with diabetes and those at risk. Whether working at the National or local level, our advocacy is underpinned by following three major issues as outlined.

#### **Improve health outcomes for people with diabetes**

INDPCP Programme estimates that over 50 million people with diabetes lack access to the treatment and care they need. Universal access to essential medicines and technologies is a critical priority of NIET and we are advocating for it at the highest level. In addition, NIETs INDPCP PROGRAMME will develop a 'model of care' to outline the essential treatment and care governments should prioritize people with diabetes, and NIETs INDPCP PROGRAMME is working to make self-management education available to all people with diabetes

#### **Prevent Type 2 Diabetes**

Preventing future cases of diabetes is vital or reduce the costs and impact of the growing burden of diabetes. NIETs INDPCP PROGRAMME is working to see health included in all policies, make healthy nutrition available for all, and promote physical activity.

## **People with diabetes and the parents or carers of people with diabetes Shall have the following Charters in/for:**

- Information and education about diabetes, including how it can be prevented, how early detection in high risk individuals is an advantage, how the disease can be managed effectively and how to access education and clinical resources through Qualified Diabetes Educators.
- High quality diabetes self-management education at diagnosis and whenever needed that integrates the clinical, behavioural and psychosocial aspects of diabetes in a group or individually.
- Be involved in assessing, planning and implementing as well as monitoring their own care and health goals through Qualified Diabetes Educators
- Reliable information about the names and dosage of any therapies and medication, their actions and potential side-effects and interactions with other medical conditions and therapies, specific to the individual through Qualified Diabetes Educators.
- Individual access to their medical records and other relevant information if requested.

## **Urban Health Center (UHC)**

The health center is set up in the Urban area and one project staff includes one project coordinator, one Community coordinator, one Medical officer, two ANMs, one MO Assistants, one Sweeper and watches are recruited run the Health centre. Mass groups are formed with Anganwadi teachers, CBO leaders, elected representatives and School education Committees in wards. The project is implemented in association with the Mass Group meetings and advisory committee and monitored under the guidance of chairman of the Municipal Commissioner, District Medical & Health Officer and Municipal Health officer.

## **Outcomes of the program**

- Increased awareness on the hygiene, sanitation and chronic diseases
- Increase the family planning operation
- Reduce the infant and maternity mortality.
- Cent percent immunization in under 5 years
- Accessing in time treatment and services delivery
- Reduce the malnutrition among children
- Prevent the female feticides
- Access for intuitional delivery

## **Action component**

- Employment / additional income opportunities for rural masses.
- Continuous source of funds for the Gaon Chalo partners in order to support their social initiatives

## **National Environment Awareness Camps:**

The SVASS organization has conducted camps frequently to the general rural population by creating awareness to keep the environment neat and clean. The rural public were educated on the lines of health and sanitation as detailed below.

To generate awareness on Environment Protection with focus on **biodiversity Conservation** the Organization had conducted essay writing competition and small sports to school Children covering nearly 200 children. To encourage children in environment protection prizes were distributed.. A Rally was organized with them carrying play cards, banners with environment protection messages for Self Help Groups Members covering 100 members the video play of the CD given by SNAPS was displayed. For the entire target group IEC Material developed by the Organizations was distributed.

### **Action component**

## **Rural Development Programmes:**

The land leveling to STs of Thirualaiahgaripalle Mudigolam village, Irala mandal was very poor and unproductive 15 acres was selected for land development. The activities include land leveling, bush clearing, bunding and application of tank silt local available resources were utilized. The beneficiaries themselves were involved for land development. The organisation had paid wages for the beneficiaries. After land development the beneficiaries had taken up dry land farming

## **Disabled Welfare Programs :-**

### **( a) Community based Rehabilitation : -**

Medical camps were organized in 5 mandals, extended referral services during the camps through community-based rehabilitation to the needy target group.

## **Health Programs :-**

### **Screening tests for Cancer & TB :**

Medical camps were launched in 2 mandals ( Piler & Rompicherla ) created awareness by conducting screening tests for the rural poor for Cancer . We also attended to referral services for cases of emergency nature directing the cases to Government hospital , Chittoor & Tirupati.

## **HIV/AIDS Awareness :**

Conducted campaigns in connection with world AIDS – Day in 4 mandals. Taking out procession with the rural local public. Organized awareness counseling to the gathering; distributed pamphlets. The targeted groups were referred for examination and treatment in Government Hospitals at Chittoor.

The goal of the project is to prevent and reduce the spread of HIV/AIDS, its related risks and infections among key population such as Truck Drivers, Quarry workers, Female Sex Workers, Injected Drug Users, and People Living with HIV/AIDS.

### **Women Empowerment :-**

#### **( a ) Shelter referral services (Short Stay Home): -**

##### **Objective:**

To provide immediate temporary shelter to female victims who are suffering due to socio-evil practices such as moral perils, family discard, psychiatric maladjustment's either in her mother's home or mother-in-law home

#### **( b ) Women Rights :-**

The SVASS organization has got five to six women groups in each of four mandals. The organization has conducted periodical awareness camps during the year about the importance of literacy which will generate to know things and matters going around and it will give courage to the women to question and ask for the legal rights for the women to better their standards in the society.

### **Education Programmes:-**

#### **a). Empowerment for Rural BPL Childre :-**

The organization had Education Improvement for 50 SC/ST/OBC Students in Rural areas and Distribution Teaching aids i.e. Books, Bags, Slates, Uniforms for primary and upper primary standards ..

#### **(b) Child Rights & Child labor Programme :-**

This organization has conducted camps in 4 mandals in the district creating awareness about the child rights existing in the constitution of India. Counseling were also delivered by the concerned subject oriented scholars to create awareness to the parents on several aspects to have advising; friendly and cordial relations with children to develop harmony; self thinking attitude; personality development; creativity etc. to elevate them as good citizens of tomorrow in the society.

## **Consumer Awareness**

This organization has conducted camps to create in Puthalapattu Palamaner and Chittoor Mandal's consumer awareness to the Rural population. Explained the need to check up the quality of the product by watching the name of company brand to assure for the price ; quality and quantity. To take proper care for purchasing adulterated local; unpacked products sounding the same voice of reputed products approved by laboratories of the respective manufacturing companies. Explained the legal steps to be taken for any problems of the products purchased by the consumers to seek legal justice.

## **National day celebration:**

Dr. Ambadkar jayanthi, Independence day, Children's day etc, were celebrated. 500 students were participated in the celebrations. The elocution, drawing and sports were conducted. The prizes were distributed to children.
